Protect Our Greenbelt and Local Green Spaces

Did you know that Mole Valley District Council continues to push inappropriate development, including major schemes on Green Belt land and over-development of key local sites that residents are fighting hard to protect?

You only need to look at the Bull Hill & Red House Gardens proposals to see how the character of our historic town and rural villages is under threat. Stopping inappropriate over-development and preserving Fetcham's rural character will be a priority, ending the neglect we have seen under years of Lib Dem and long-serving Conservative administrations.



Stop Bull Hill and Red House Gardens development

Just some of the sites at risk of being lost or ruined include:

Bull Hill & Red House Gardens (Leatherhead) - a proposed 12-storey high tower block with over 450 units receiving over 400 letters of objection already (with 20% from Fetcham residents) to the current plans for hundreds of homes, high-rises and major traffic changes

Fetcham Green Belt Solar Farm - 52 hectares of prime agricultural land

North Leatherhead Green Belt - new housing estates (e.g. 47 homes recently approved)

Building or developing on such a scale will mean:

- Fewer school places for local children
- More congested roads (especially Fetcham access to Leatherhead station)
- Longer waits for GP and hospital appointments
- Loss of precious open green space and views in the heart of our communities

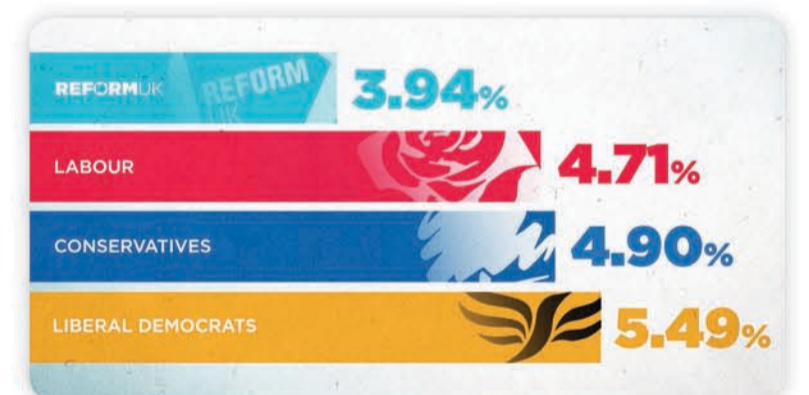
Reform UK councillors will seek to preserve local greenbelt, protect valued open spaces like Bull Hill and fight against inappropriate development.
